

Citywide Bargaining Update

What did the union propose on Feb. 28?

The union made a series of proposals to improve recruitment and retention, address chronic understaffing, and our working conditions:

- Increase night shift differential, preceptor pay, bilingual pay, lead person pay, field training officer pay, and other premiums.
- Protect our jobs against Al.
- Improve and expand the union's right to ensure adequate mandatory and paid safety trainings to keep our members safe in light of the increased hazards of our jobs.
- Protect employees' right to use vacation time and improve cash out of accrued unused time.
- Fix internal inequities between similar job classifications like 2302 and 2303, between 2903 and 2908, between 2907 and 2909.
- Require the City not wait until the last second to extend a probationary period.
- Increase uniform allowances.
- Improve standby pay.
- Clean up overtime language to protect access to overtime pay for employees who work extra to meet staffing needs.
- End Z-class, so all employees can be paid overtime.
- Ensure that newly-hired employees get appropriate salary step placement based on their prior relevant experience without management favoritism and discrimination.
- Create a union seat on the Civil Service Commission.

Yes, we DO have the right to strike!


